Ever since the establishment of SMS Books (predecessor to Crask Books) was established in 2002 it has been the practice to donate 5% of the gross profit on book sales to the John Buchan Story or its predecessor the John Buchan Centre. There have also been a number of books sold on their behalf where they do not fit readily with the stock of books that are held for sale at the John Buchan Story. Thanks to the continued support of customers over £3000 has been raised for the Museum by this means.

Over the past year or two a couple of fairly large collections have been donated to the John Buchan Story and it is now appropriate to bring together all the books held for sale on their behalf into a pre-Christmas catalogue. The majority of these are books by, contributed to or about John Buchan but there are also a number of books by other members of John Buchan's family and a smaller number of books of general Scottish Borders interest.

In the case of all the books in this catalogue 80%, rather than 5%, of the profits will go to the John Buchan Story so buying these books will make a significant contribution to running costs.

Please note that the John Buchan Story is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation no. SC042519.

Condition of books

The condition of books is described using a conventional system of gradings. Regular collectors/buyers will be familiar with these but an explanation of the system follows.

Where the book has a dustwrapper (also known as a dust jacket) the condition will be shown in the format XX/XX where the code before the forward slash describes the condition of the book and the code after it describes the condition of the dustwrapper. The codes are as follows:

F (Fine) A book or dustwrapper which is invirtually as new condition.

VG+ (Very good plus) A book which is almost as new but has minor damage, e.g. a tiny mark on the covers or perhaps one creased page corner. A d/w may have slight creasing in one place.

VG (Very good) A generally sound book which may have some damage, e.g. light wear at the corners, a faded spine or occasional brown spots on the pages. A d/w may be worn at the corners or have one or two small tears around the edges.

VG- (Very good minus) An average, well-used book which has some damage, e.g. bumped corners or cracked hinges. Dustwrapper would have handling stains, some tears and a little raggedness at the edges.

G+ (Good plus) A reasonable book which has been well used and may have stains on the covers, broken hinges, creased pages or substantial numbers of pages that are foxed (brown speckled areas on the pages). A dustwrapper may be stained or ragged and have small pieces missing.

Lower gradings G (good), G- (good minus) and P (poor) refer to books which have varying degrees of significant damage such as covers which have come adrift, loose pages, missing illustrations or severe staining. Dustwrappers may have missing flaps, splits along folds or heavy stains.
