Blanchard C129 King Georg VI and Queen Elizabeth visited Canada, the USA and Newfoundland in May and June 1939. This was the first visit to Canada by a reigning monarch and was hugely successful. This illustrated record of the visit includes all of the speeches made by the King during the tour. Many, if not all, of those made in Canada were drafted by John Buchan in his capacity as Governor-General. 64 pages. Cream cloth with gold lettering and decoration. Patterned endpapers. Numerous illustrations. The spine is lightly browned but otherwise the book is very good throughout. The cream dustwrapper has some small black marks on the front and a couple of small closed tears.

The covers are detached and are ragged and creased around the edges. Internally good but the margins are lightly browned and some page corners turned
